Blues band to visit Dallas

DALLAS — The borough will come alive Friday night, in the first of a planned series of events to draw attention to the town's assets.

"Arts in the Borough" will kick off Friday at Libations Pub, Main Street, where the Clarence Spady Band will perform the blues from 8 p.m. to midnight.

Organizers hope this will be an eventful summer in the borough, said Connie Scott, a member of the Dallas Visioning Committee and head of entertainment of this year's Harvest Festival. "There will be a little something for everyone."

In addition to the band, the committee and its community partners hope to hold one or two more events this summer, culminating with the Harvest Festival, beginning on Sept. 17 and running through Sept 19. A farmer's market is also a possibility in the near future.

Arts in the Borough, though, has a much higher purpose than just entertainment, according to borough Manager Joe Moskovitz.

"The essence of the program is one of the viable components of a downtown revitalization plan," said Moskovitz. "Arts is the perfect event to rekindle interest in the downtown."

The Harvest Festival last year, according to Scott, was a

huge success, with about 5,000 people attending.

The cost of the show at Libations is \$2 and the Dallas Visioning Committee hopes to feature additional acts at the appropriate venues in the downtown area.

"We're not looking to make money," said Moskovitz. "We want to make sure that residents and stakeholders take interest in their community and

raise community pride and visibility. Hopefully it will lead to things like street performers and a number of other amenities for visitors to frequent."
