Mould honored for achievements at Misericordia

College Misericordia Athletic Director Michael Mould was recently presented with the GeneralSports TURF Systems AD of the Year Award at the annual National Association of Collegiate Directors of Athletics Convention in Dallas, Texas.

Mould will retire this summer after 42 years as an athletics administrator. He was one four Division III

The award highlights the efforts of athletics directors at all levels for their commitment and contributions to campuses and their surrounding communities.

Mould spearheaded Misericordia's transition from the NAIA ranks to the NCAA Division III in the early 1990s and its eventual memberships in the Pennsylvania Athletic Conference and Eastern College Athletic Conference.

Under Mould, the college added the Anderson Sports-Health Center, Mangelsdorf Field at the Anderson Outdoor Athletic Complex and a new tennis complex to its facilities.

In conjunction with the Alumni Affairs Department, Mould was a driving force behind the development of the College Misericordia Athletics Hall of Fame, which inducted its first class in 2003. In addition to a stint as president of the PAC, he has served on numerous PAC, ECAC and NCAA committees.
