to third, which Mike Prater fielded and fired to Pat Murray at second. But the ball tipped off the end of Murray's glove, so runners were now on first and second with one out.

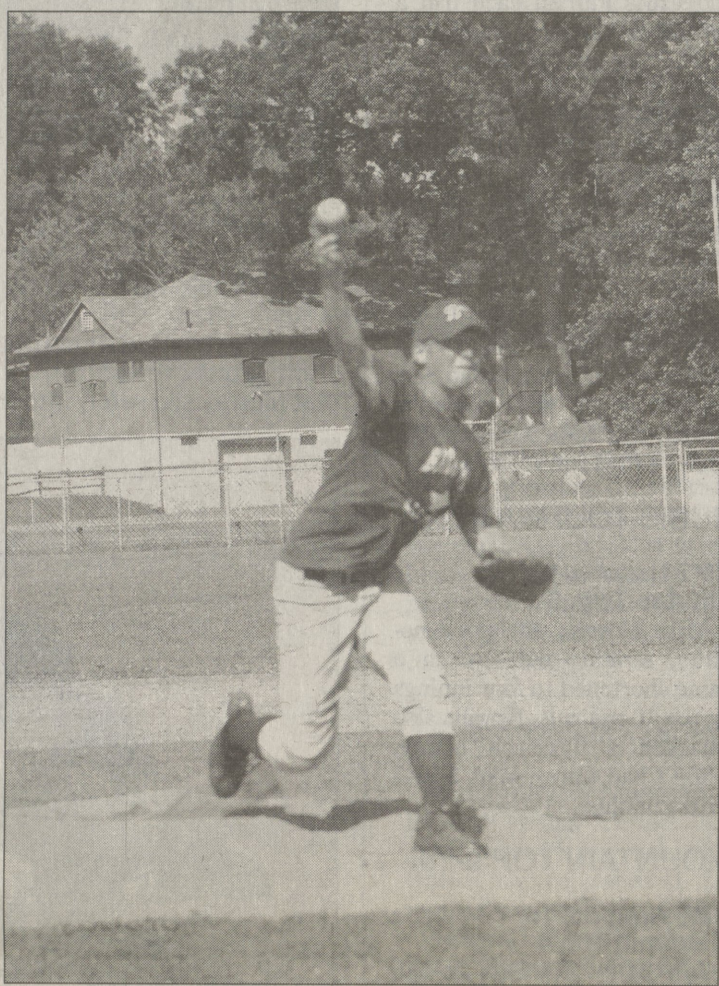
A passed ball allowed both runners to move up before Harding struck out Steve Bilheimer.

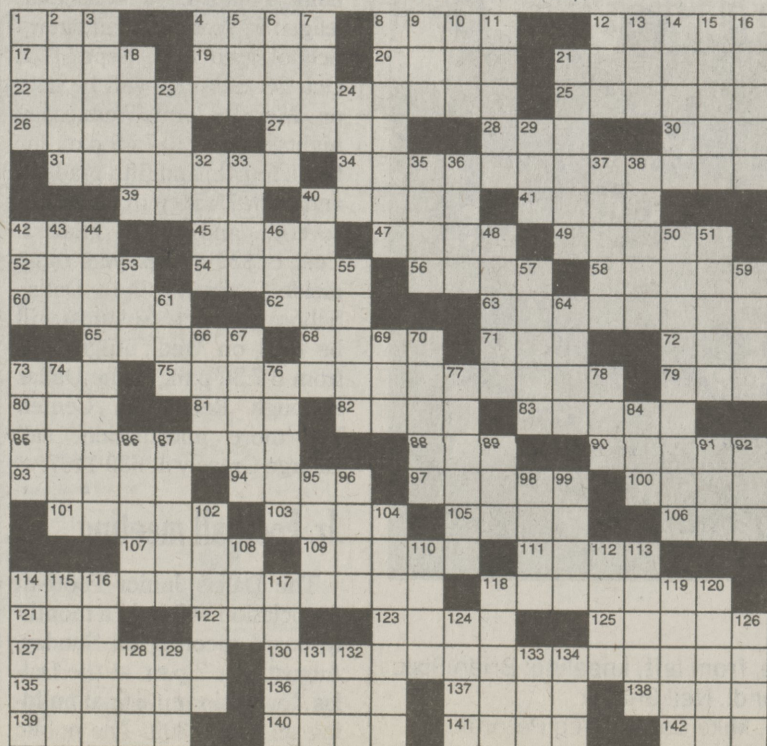

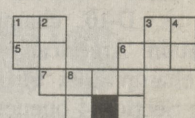
