which looked at the reality of the situation.

"We have been talking about these two churches coming together for at least the last five years," she said. "There are so many Methodist churches in the Back Mountain which are reminiscent of the horse and buggy days when people couldn't drive miles to get to church. Now we find ourselves with smaller numbers and a duplication of services. We figured if we combined the two churches, we would be more efficient, have less work and more time to enjoy each other.

For the near future, the combined congregations of more than 400 people will worship and have Sunday school classes at the Lehman church off of Rt.

Russell is very protective of her parishioners' feelings and sensitive to the memories and the needs of both of her congregations.



"We want to build not only for ourselves, but to offer our facility to the community to expand the space and activities, especially for our youth," Russell said.





