Making a smooth switch to signal-caller

Ryan Arcangeli thought he would be a lineman, but instead is at quarterback.

When Greg Myers was hired in January as Lake-Lehman's new football coach, Ryan Arcangeli was preparing for his senior season as an offensive lineman.

"When I first met Ryan, I noticed that he was extremely knowledgeable about the game of football," said Myers. "He was able to discuss the details of the game and understand various strategies. There aren't a lot of high school players who have that kind of understand-

Myers thought Arcangeli's intellect would be beneficial to the team. "I had an idea of what type of offense I was going to run and what would be required of the quarterback," Myers explained. "We expect our quarterback to read defenses and make checks at the line of scrimmage, and I thought Ryan would be able to do that."

Arcangeli was certainly surprised by the move. "I had no idea I'd be playing quarterback this year" he said. "I was working hard in the weight room trying to prepare for the season as a lineman. Coach asked me to give quarterback a try and it's worked out pretty well."

While the move came as a surprise, playing quarterback wasn't totally foreign to the 18year-old son of Mike and Pat Arcangeli. "I'd played quarterback in junior high, but I never played a down at the position in


Hole in one for Joe Bevevino
