Coughlin 5, Tunkhannock 1

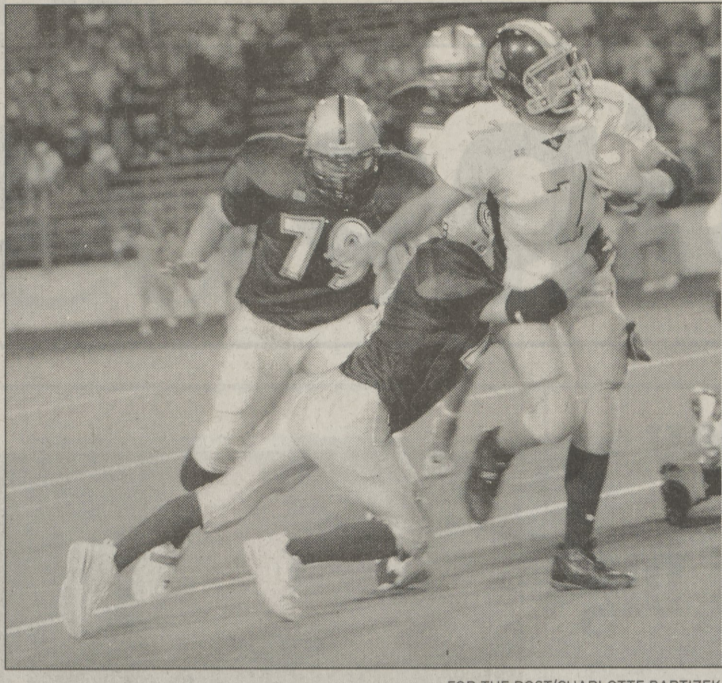
Oct. 11 — Tia Robinson had the lone win for the Tigers in a No. 4 singles match.

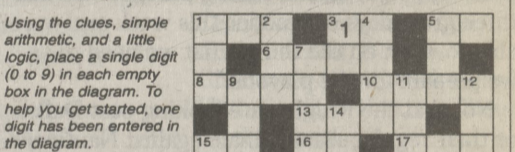

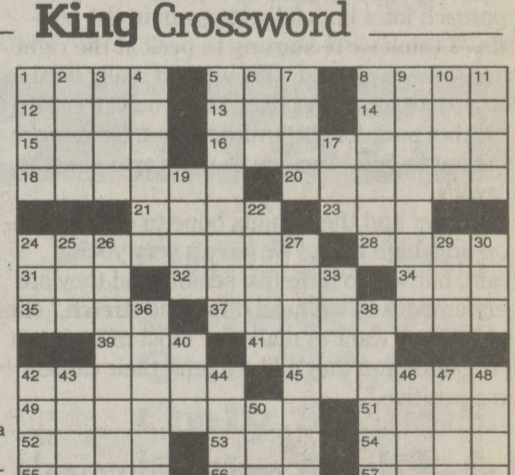
