Statistically speaking, a fairly even matchup

Going into the last two weeks of the regular season, the Dallas and Lake-Lehman football teams stacked up pretty well against each other on paper.

Dallas quarterback Matt Kelly and Lake-Lehman quarterback Ryan Arcangeli, are ranked first and second, respectively, in Division 2A play. Kelly had a slight advantage on touchdown passes with 15 on the season and a quarterback rating of 162.99, but Arcangeli's numbers were in the same neighborhood, with 1195 yards passing to Kelly's 1173, 11 touchdowns, and a 141.73 quarterback rating.

The Mountaineers have an edge in the running attack, with Doug Harris averaging 5.5 yards per carry for 733 yards with 12 touchdowns. He had more than double the carries of

Lehman's leading rusher, Greg Pimm, 133 to Pimm's 61 rushes for 343 yards. Dallas' Nick Samanas also poses a running threat, averaging 7.8 yards a carry on 26 attempts. Arcangeli has 204 yards on 88 carries, an average of 2.3 yards per carry.

Both teams, however, have a dangerous receiving corps, with Chris Boyle leading Division 2A with 41 receptions for 477 yards and three touchdowns for the Black Knights. Teammate Rick Shoefield has 17 receptions for 463 yards, an average of 27.2 yards per catch, and seven touchdowns. The Mountaineers have the second and third-ranked receivers in the division, Samanas and Mike Race, who both average 14.7 yards per catch. Samanas has caught 27 passes for 398 yards and three touchdowns and Race 26 for 382, with nine

touchdown receptions. Derek Shurmanek may also play a role in the passing game for Lehman, averaging 7.4 yards a catch with a touchdown.

Although both teams have shown they can put points on the board, the Mountaineers have more than double the touchdowns scored as Lehman. Dallas' lead scorers, Race, Harris and Kelly had combined for 26 touchdowns through the first eight games, while Shoefield and Pimm had combined for 12. Race also doubles as kicker for the Mountaineers, and he has put through 15 extra points and three field goals so far for a total of 78 points.

Dallas also leads Lehman in total offensive yards per game, 351.9 to 266.3 and has allowed only 207 total yards on defense to Lehman's 336.8.

55 years of Old Shoe game scores

There have been 55 Old Shoe Games, starting in 1948, when three Back Mountain high schools played. The trophy originally was presented to the team with the best record. Only later, particularly after school consolidation, did a single game determine the holder of the Old Shoe trophy. There have been three ties, in 1956, 1982 and 1988. More than half the time, the losing team has not scored, and there was a streak of eight shutouts from 1989 to 1996. Three games have been decided by a single point; 1953, 1977 and 1980. The largest winning margin was a 50-0 victory by Dallas in 1972. In the 13 years during which three teams played, Dallas won only once. Since then, Dallas has won 33 times, Lehman nine.

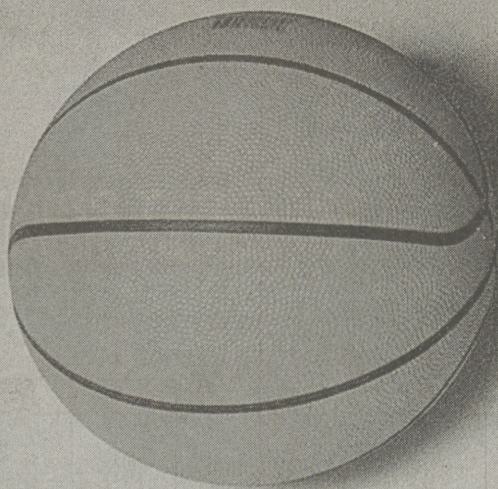
