At Lake-Lehman, Clancy has 20 players on the roster where he hopes to turn around a team that was winless a year ago.

"The guys are very energetic and are working hard," said Clancy. "Our biggest obstacle right now is a lack of confidence in ourselves. I have confidence in our kids, but they need to believe in themselves."

Clancy, who was a standout on winning teams at Lake-Lehman and Wilkes University, hopes an aggressive approach will serve as a confidence boost for the Knights.

"We're going to try to pick up the tempo," said Clancy. "We want to try to dictate the pace of the game by pushing the ball up the floor and being aggressive on defense. I think we can make some good things happen."

"The kids have been outstanding to work with," said Clancy. "Our seniors really want to have a good season and are working hard. I think we can do some good things."



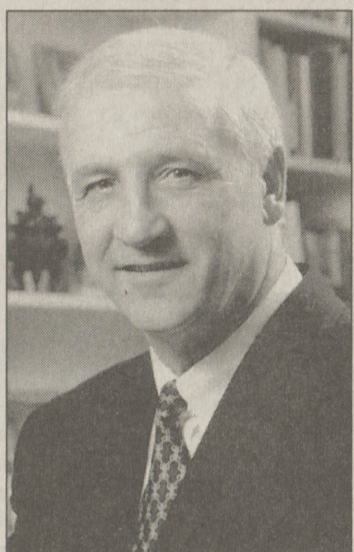
Spirit captures U-10 fall outdoor league

Wyoming Seminary plans gathering to honor Antinnes

Wyoming Seminary alumni and friends are invited to a special holiday gathering in honor of Marvin Antinnes, former Sem head football coach and admission officer, on Thursday, Dec. 9 from 5:30 to 8 p.m. at the Westmoreland Club, 59 South Franklin St., Wilkes-Barre.

Antinnes, who retired from his 37-year career at Sem in June, 2004, served as head football coach for the Blue Knights for 27 years. The team was undefeated in 1969, 1976-79 and 1985, and from 1975-80 had an unbeaten streak of 32 games, the longest high school football winning streak on the East Coast at the time. When Antinnes concluded his coaching career in 1993, he had a win-loss record of 133-47-3. He also served for more than 10 years as Director of Financial Aid, Associate Director of Admission and special Assistant to the President for Athletics and External Affairs. Game Commission offers wildlife harvest videos

In cooperation with "Wild Harvest Videos," the Pennsylvania Game Commission is offering six videos designed to help hunters get the most from their wild game harvests. Produced by Jerry Chiappetta and featuring Certified Master Chef Milos Cihelka, these videos show step-by-step the best care for game animals from the field to the table.

Video selections include:

- **Big Game: Field to Table**, is a 90-minute video that covers everything from field-dressing to proper freezer wrapping. This video also offers easy-to-follow directions on how to butcher a deer, as well as a few hunting camp recipes.
- **Venison: Healthy and Tasty**, is an 80-minute video that offers mouth-watering recipes for venison stew, pot roasts with sour cream, classic venison roasts, sauteed steak

with mushrooms, as well as suitable side dishes, marinades and more.

- **Venison: Aging, Smoking & Sausage Making**, is a 55-minute video designed for the average hunter who enjoys smoked venison, jerky, salami, sausage and hot sticks.
- **Care & Cooking: Gamebirds and Small Game Animals**, is a 70-minute video that offers instructions on how to age gamebirds and when to pluck or when to skin them for the best flavor and tenderness. The video also provides recipes for several dishes.
- **Care & Cooking: Upland Gamebirds**, is a 75-minute video that also offers instructions on how to age gamebirds and when to pluck or when to skin them for the best flavor and tenderness. It also includes suggestions on how to age gamebirds and create many delicious meals.
- **Care & Cooking:**

Waterfowl, is a 75-minute video that focuses on preparing great meals from ducks and geese. Starting with proper field care and how to transport game, the video also provides instructions on how to age waterfowl before plucking or skinning. As with all other videos, this one provides several recipes for game.

'Identifier' available for beginning bird watchers

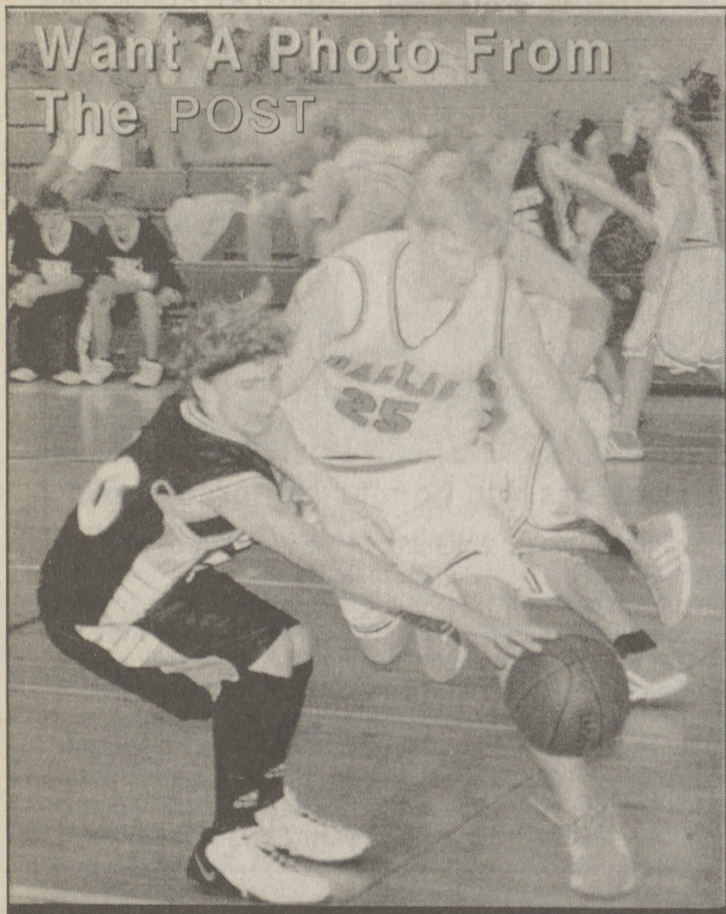
To assist beginning bird watchers, the Pennsylvania Game Commission has added a bird song audio "identifier" to its list of merchandise available through "The Outdoor Shop" on its website (www.pgc.state.pa.us). Just click on "Merchandise," select "Misc. Items" and scroll down to the bird song audio identifier.

The device, which sells for \$35.50, comes with two audio cards, an earphone for in-the-field use, a bird-watching guide booklet and three AAA batteries already inserted.

The cards that come with the Identifier are the Yard Bird series. Each card has the name and a drawing of the bird. By pressing the button beside the each bird, the Identifier will play a short sample of the bird's song.

Other song card series cost \$10.50 plus tax and consist of one card each.

The Warbler Identification System, which costs \$33.75, is a four-card pack that features 40 different types of warblers, including the Northern water thrush, yellow-breasted chat and the Kirtland's. The pack includes a special booklet on identifying the different types of warblers.
