All-regional team selections become eligible to be picked All-American. A committee of the six regional chairpersons, plus a national chairperson, picked 16 players to the first team and 6 more to the second team. The Mideast Regional chair was Midd-West High School head field hockey coach Matt Soto. There were no WVC representatives on any of the commit-

"Five out of 16 from the same league" as first team All-Americans, Ragukas said, "is pretty great. That shows how much skill our conference

Ragukas is the third Lake-Lehman player to be named All-American, and the first to earn first-team honors. Sara Kasper (1997) and Janelle Perlis (1998, 1999) were second-team picks. Ragukas had 16 goals and 17 assists for the Black Knights this season.

"I don't even know what to say," Ragukas said. "I'm speechless. It's such a great honor."
