Three Knights — Shane Stark, 100, Neil Dierolf, 138, and Wally Simko, 210 - scored victories in the consolation finals to cop third place honors.



100 wins great, but John Hettes has another goal

The senior 130-pounder could set an all-time win mark. But he'd most like to get to the state tournament.

When it comes to Dallas High School wrestling, John Hettes may not be in a class by himself, but it certainly doesn't take long to call the roll.

The 130-pound senior became just the second wrestler in school history to eclipse the 100-win mark for his career with a 16-1 technical fall of Nanticoke's Steve Haas on Jan. 14.

Hettes and 2003 graduate Perry Coolbaugh are the only two wrestlers ever surpass the 100-win plateau for the Mountaineers.

While 100 wins are impressive enough, the accomplishment is even more astonishing when you consider that former Dallas standouts Jerry Ogurkis, Craig Rome, Sean Kavanaugh and Brian Corbett failed to reach the milestone.

"It's exciting to reach 100 wins, but I'm glad it's finally over," said Hettes, who has wrestled for three different head coaches during his varsity career. "It's a huge relief to have and now I can concentrate on the rest of the season."

With a career record of 100-28, Hettes is also closing in Coolbaugh's school record for career victories
