Jan. 25 — Scranton Prep took first in eight of 12 events, but Tunkhannock won the meet on overall depth in a Northern Division meet.

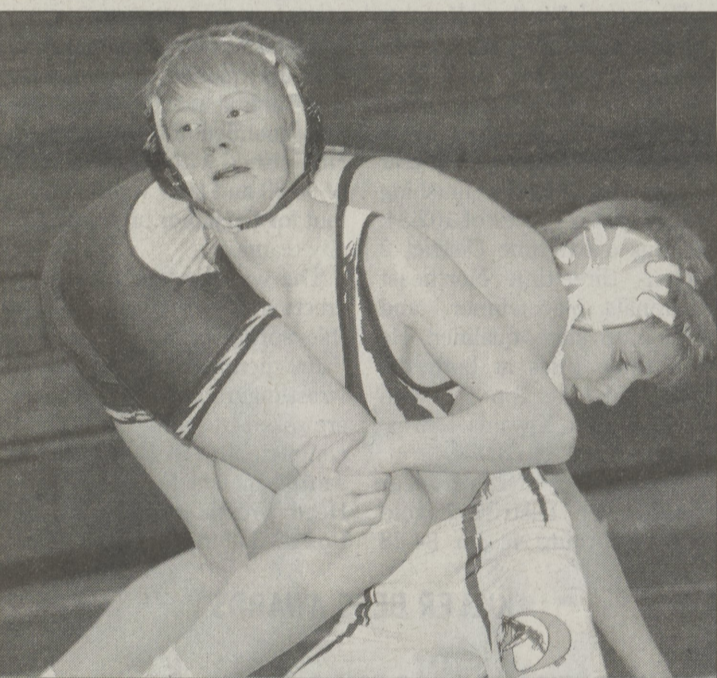
Steve Vanduzer and Miguel Echevarria were double winners for the Tigers, and Ken Alguire took first in diving.

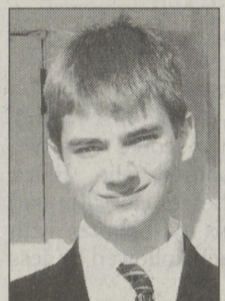
Rogers will perform with more than 600 musically talented high school students from the District of Columbia and 11 states of the Eastern region of the United States.

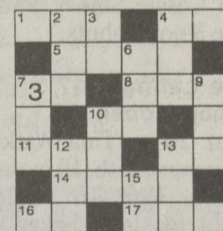

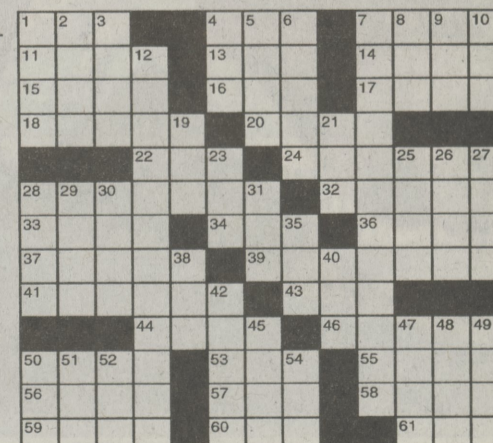
