The schedule is as follows: March 14: "The Boxer," directed by Jim Sheridan.

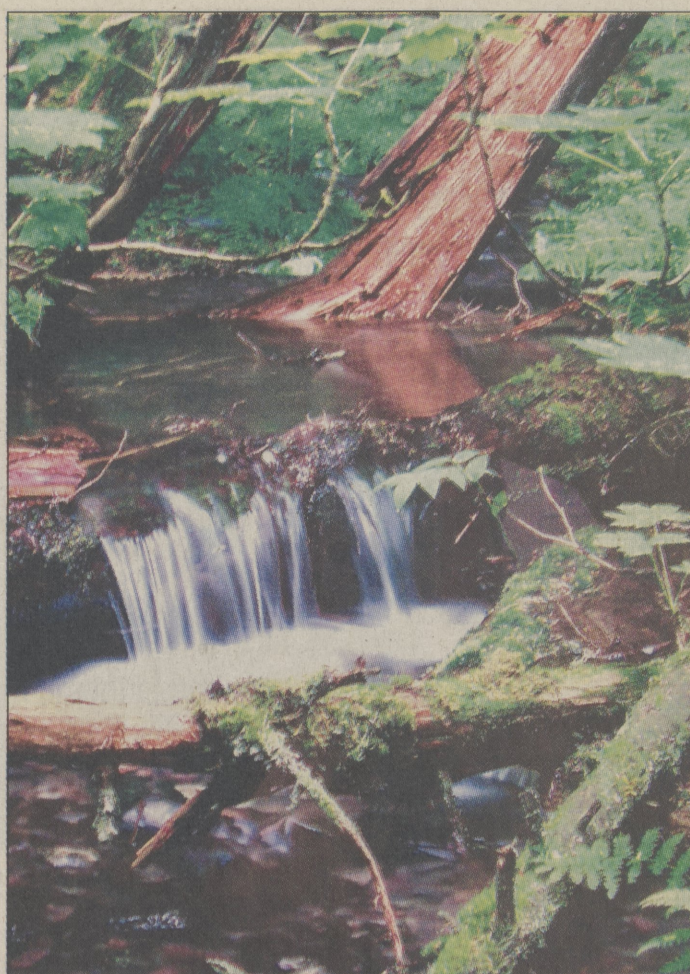
