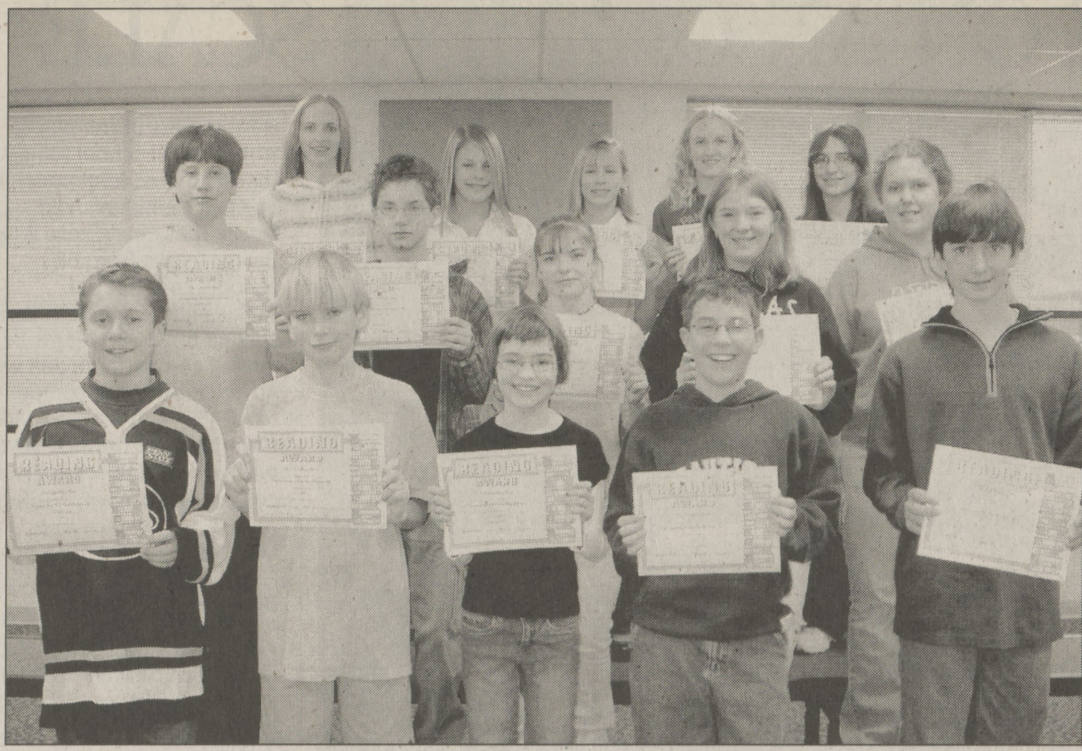
Parents and their children are encouraged to attend the evening session together.

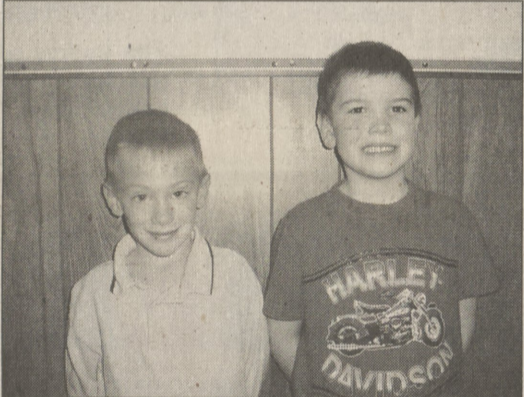

PSU seminar on ethical dilemmas in technology

Gerald L. Engel, Ph.D., president of the Institute of Electrical and Electronic Engineers (IEEE) Computer Society, will speak in the Science Building at Penn State Wilkes-Barre on Wednesday, March 23, at 6 p.m.

Dr. Engel has conducted extensive research on social and ethical issues in technology and will present an interactive discussion of the increasing ethical dilemmas that face technology professionals in the workforce today.

Dr. Engel teaches computer science and engineering at the University of Connecticut. He is a member of the board of directors of the Accreditation Board for Engineering and Technology. He is a past president of the IEEE Society on the Social Implications of Technology.

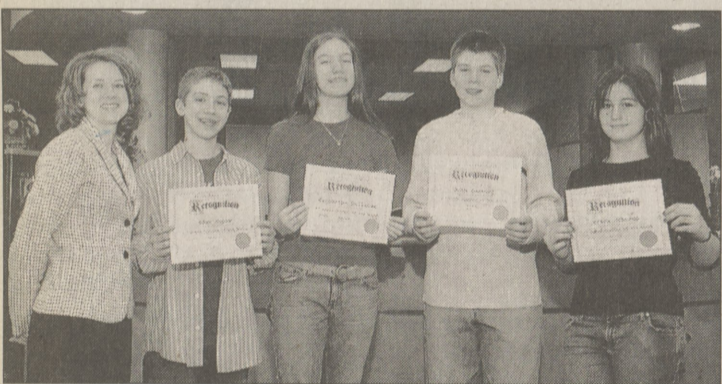
