# Meeting will address hunting at Slocum Park

The State's Department of Conservation and Natural Resources (DCNR) will conduct a public meeting April 29 at Frances Slocum State Park, to discuss control methods which may be utilized to better manage the deer and geese population within the park. The meeting will be held from 6 to 7 p.m. at the Environmental Interpretive Center. A detailed map displaying the proposed changes will be on hand. Discussion topics will focus on expanded hunting opportunities for Canada geese and white-tailed deer.

Opportunities for goose hunting will be considered along the extreme western shoreline of the lake. This will greatly increase the opportunity for hunters to help control the goose population, which is currently affecting the water quality and raising health concerns. Archery hunting for white-tailed deer will be proposed for areas outside the day-use or heavily used areas of the park. All hunting within the confines of the park will be subject to the rules and regulations established by the Pennsylvania Game Commission and the Department of Conservation of Natural Resources.

A 30-day public comment period will follow the meeting. All comments should be directed to Frances Slocum State Park, 565 Mt. Olivet Rd., Wyoming, Pa. 18644 via mail, telephone, in person, or e-mail. For more information, call the park office at 696-3525.
