BASEBALL

**Bishop O'Reilly 4, Seton 1**  
Apr. 26 — Matt Rutkoski pitched a complete-game six-hitter while striking out four to lead the Queensmen.  
Matt Ruch added a pair of hits and scored two runs for O'Reilly.
