Matt Dragon was awarded the Tracey Slocum Memorial Award, which honors the senior wrestler with the most career wins. During his final season at Lake-Lehman, Matt became the all-time leading Wyoming Valley Conference wrestler in victories. He compiled a career record of 166-11.

He was a four-time District 2 champion, a three-time Northeast Regional champion, and a three-time state medal winner, where he finished fifth as a sophomore, third as a junior and first as a senior. He finished his senior season with a 45-0 mark. "Matt's one of those unique individuals who comes along once in a lifetime," said Lipski.

the award will be renamed the Matt Dragon Award, in honor of Matt's drive to become the best wrestler in Lake-Lehman history. Besides winning, the award will recognize team leadership, academics, setting lofty goals and becoming a state qualifier. "Matt has raised the bar for Lake-Lehman wrestling" quipped Lipski.
