Brooke Ellison, author and motivational speaker, will be the guest speaker and receive an honorary degree at College Misericordia's 79th annual commencement ceremony. Andrew J. Ellison was hit by a car in 1990 at the age of 11 while she was on her way home from school. The accident left her paralyzed from the neck down ventilator-dependent. Despite her physical situation, she was determined to continue with her life. Her accomplishments include honors in poetry, science, math and literature. Her most notable achievement occurred in 2000, when she graduated magna cum laude from Harvard University and gave a commencement address to her class. She graduated with an A- average in cognitive neuroscience, a combined major of psychology and biology.

In January 2002, Brooke and her mother, Jean Ellison, published a book titled, "The Brooke Ellison Story," which

documents their family's experiences from the day of Brooke's accident until her graduation from Harvard. The book was made into a movie, directed by


