

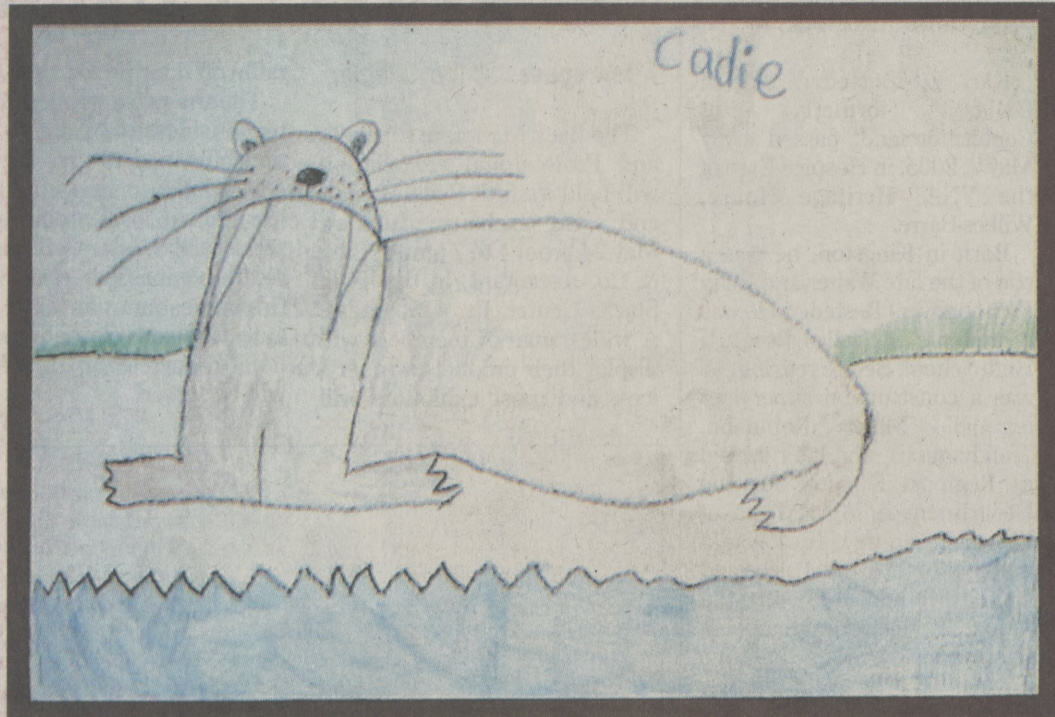
'Adrienne's Garden' awards honor young artists

The 10th annual "Adrienne's Garden" Art Awards ceremony is scheduled for Sunday, May 22 from 1 to 3 p.m. at Tyler Memorial Hospital. The awards are presented by the Tyler Health Foundation as a memorial to Adrienne P. Maillet and her love of art.

Everyone who attends the event will be asked to cast the ballot for the "People's Choice" award, which will be presented to the student whose artwork is chosen as the favorite piece.

Recipients of the art awards are kindergarten through eighth grade students who have demonstrated an aptitude for art during the academic year. The awards recognize the students for their accomplishments and encourage further development of their talents. These awards spotlighting and encouraging students have sparked a noticeable growth in the number of students pursuing careers in the visual arts. This early recognition of talent continues to shape the lives of the award winners through their school years and beyond. The awards are funded totally through donations.

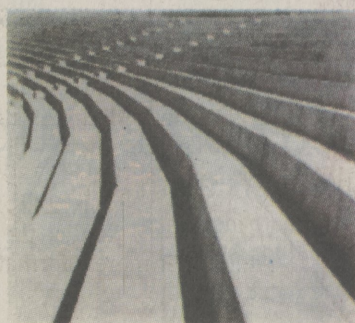
