

It marked the first conference loss for Lake-Lehman since May 8, 2003, and only the fourth WVC loss for the Black Knights since 1992. And it's been at least 13 years since the Black Knights suffered a straight-set loss against a WVC opponent.

"Coach Nark" stayed in touch with his Lake-Lehman family, sometimes bringing homemade pastries to the high school, said Barbara Cragle, longtime school secretary.

Former Lake-Lehman athletic director Rich Gorgone, who coached with Narkiewicz for more than two decades, attended the dedication ceremony. "It was beautiful ceremony, but it was bittersweet for me," said Gorgone. "It was a very nice tribute
