Dallas wins District 2 title

May 25 — The Lady Mountaineers shut out Coughlin for the third time this season, and the 2-0 victory gave Dallas the title the Lady Crusaders had held the two previous year.

Dallas (16-0-1) will host the District 3 fourth seed on Tuesday at College Misericordia in the first round of the PIAA Spring Soccer Tournament.
