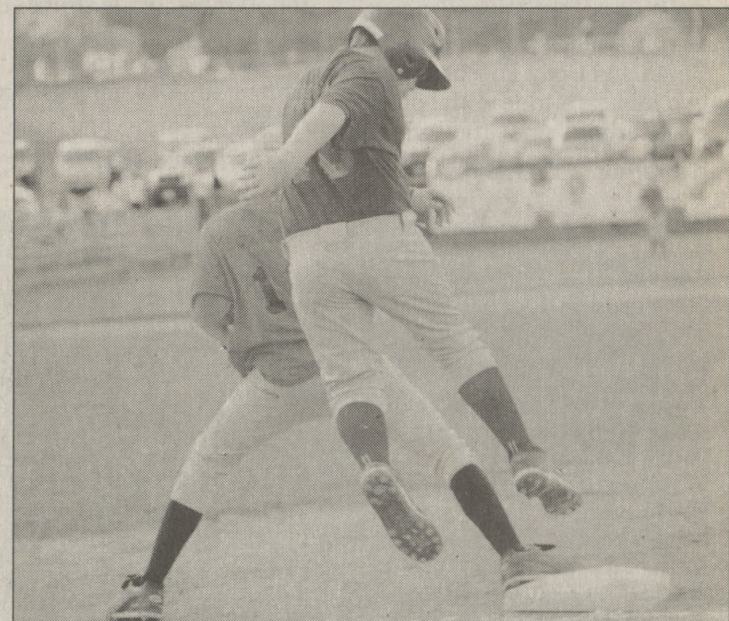
Rockets 21, Bob Horlacher 18

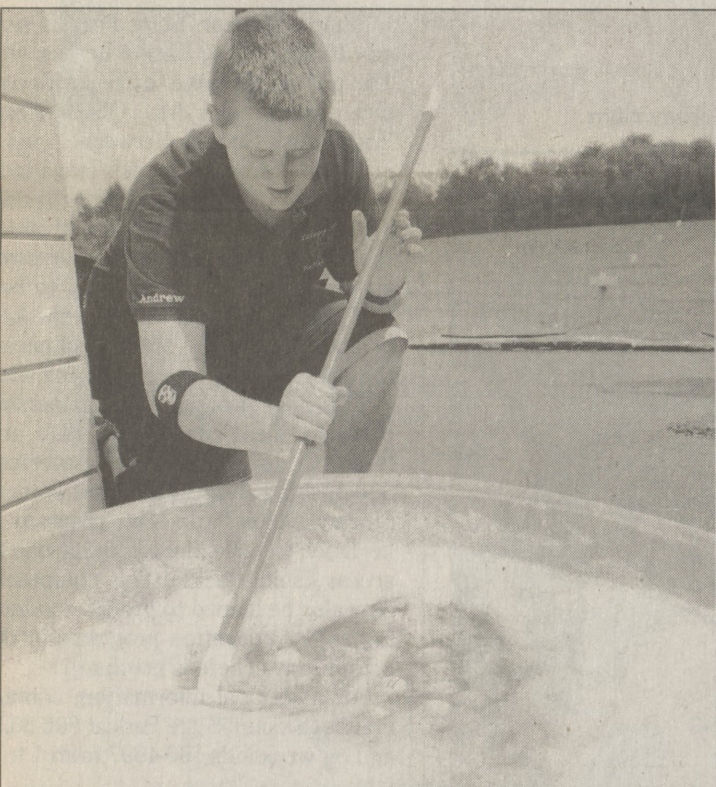
HARVEYS LAKE LITTLE LEAGUE

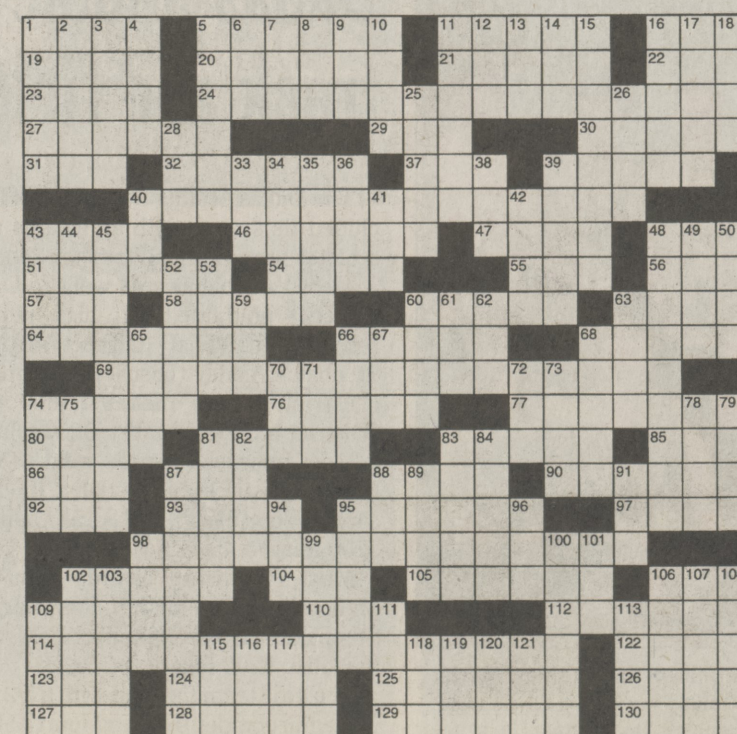
Boys age 8 to 15 may enroll. The \$115 cost of each session includes a t-shirt, basketball, lunch and use of the pool.

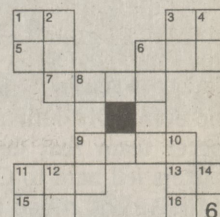


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Rational Numbers

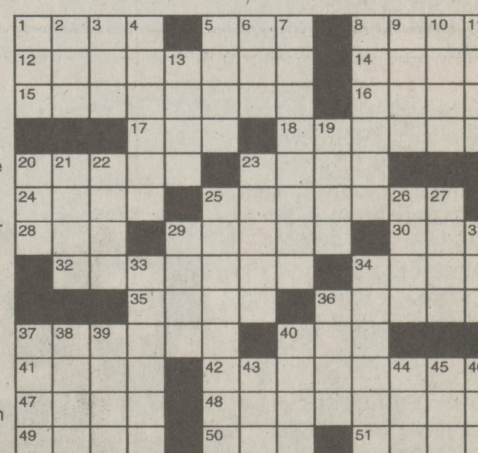
