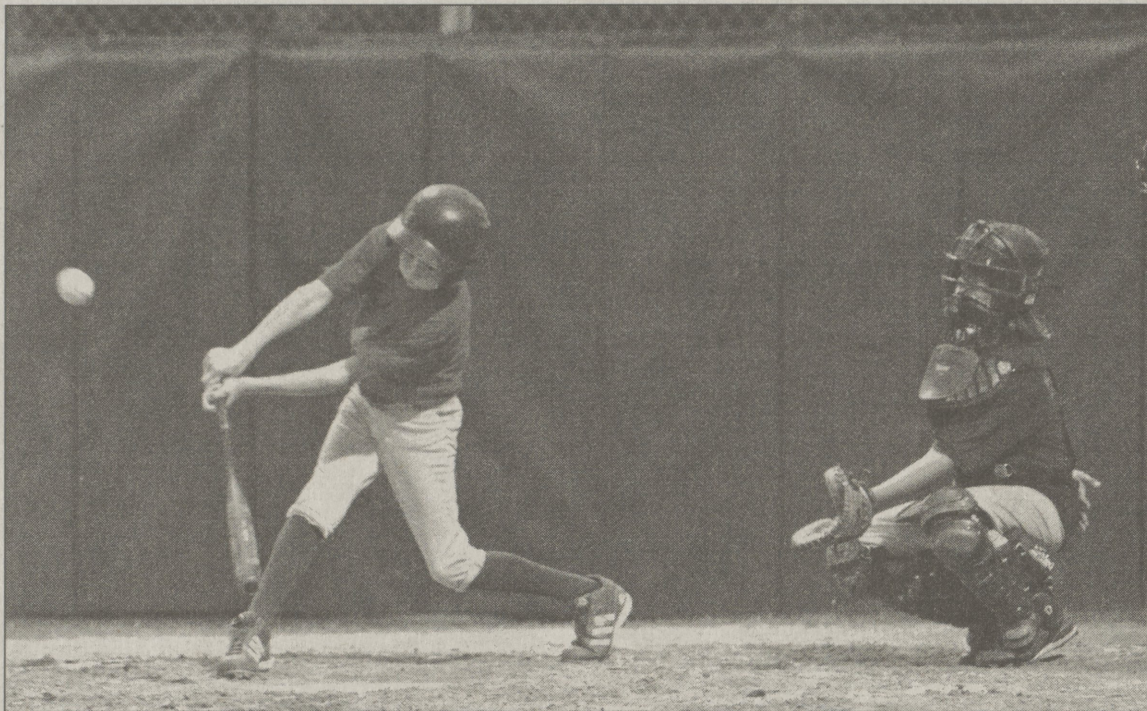
AMERICAN LEGION BASEBALL

Park offers free loan of fishing gear

Frances Slocum State Park is now an official Fishing Tackle Loaner site. The public can come to the park's contact station, 565 Mt. Olivet Road, Friday thru Sunday between 1 and 8 p.m. and borrow rods, reels and a tackle box full of hooks and other tackle. The equipment is borrowed in much the same way books are borrowed from a library.

Those wanting to borrow gear complete a form and the loan is made. At the end of the loan period the equipment is returned to the site.

This pilot program is a partnership between the Pennsylvania Fish and Boat Commission, the American Sportfishing Association, and Frances Slocum State Park. The program is designed to make

it easy for anyone to access fishing tackle. This equipment may also be loaned to groups conducting angler education programs in the community. There is no charge.
