DALLAS SCHOOL DISTRICT 2005-06 INFORMATION

The Dallas High School announces that the 2005-06 school year will begin for all students in the district Tuesday, Aug. 30. The professional staff of the Dallas schools will participate in orientation programs on Monday, Aug. 29.

Here is some information that was provided from each school:

High school

The first day of school is a full-day session. The high school begins at 8 a.m. and dismisses at 2:58 p.m. Any concerns regarding bus transportation should be addressed to bus coordinator Susan Farr at the administration office.

All seniors, juniors and sophomores should consult the bulletin board listings at the main entrance and cafeteria, and report to their assigned homerooms at 8 a.m. Freshmen are requested to consult the bulletin board listings at the main office entrance and report to their assigned homerooms. Students who have not registered for school should register at the administration office.

The school lunch program will begin the first day. Lunches for senior high school students are \$1.80 or may be purchased ala-cart.

The following dress code is for high school students:

All students are expected to take pride in their personal appearance. Students should come to school well-groomed, wearing clothes that are neat, clean and in good taste. All students must wear clothing that does not expose undergarments, stomachs, backs or shoulders. Shorts, dresses and skirts must be mid-thigh in length or longer. Any clothing or accessories that refer to drugs, alcohol, tobacco, sexual innuendo or potentially offensive language will not be permitted.

Middle school

Preparations have been made for the opening of the Dallas Middle School. All sixth, seventh, and eighth grade students must report to the middle school building between 7:45-8 a.m. Aug. 30. Sixth grade students should go directly to the auditorium. Seventh grade students should go to the gymnasium and eighth grade students should go directly to the cafeteria.

A short orientation program, including assignment to homerooms, will be made and students will then report to their respective homerooms.

Students will be able to purchase lunch beginning with the first day of school. The price is \$1.65 for a regular lunch and 40 cents for reduced lunches. Students who participated in the free or reduced lunch program last year will begin the new year on the same status.

Dallas Elementary

Classes at the Dallas Elementary School will begin Aug.

30. Students should ride the bus to and from school on the first day of school. If parents feel it is necessary to accompany a child to school during the first week, it is suggested that the student ride the bus and the parent meet their child at the school.

Class lists will be posted at the school beginning at 3 p.m. Wednesday, Aug. 24. Students who know their homeroom assignments should report there directly. Students in grades 2-5 who do not know their homeroom assignments should report to the cafeteria, while first-graders should report to the library. Volunteers will be available to assist the students.

School lunches are \$1.55 and milk may be purchased for 45 cents.

Wycallis Elementary

Classes at the Gerald J. Wycallis Elementary School will begin Aug. 30. The professional staff has been working through the summer to plan for a smooth opening.

Students in the first through fifth grades will attend full day sessions from 9:10 a.m. to 3:40 p.m. The school building will open at 9 a.m. each day. Student supervision will begin at this time. On the first day, students in grades one through five will report directly to their classrooms. Faculty and staff will be available to assist students to their classrooms.

It is recommended that students ride the bus on the first few days of school, so they can learn their bus assignment and the district will have accurate transportation records. If parents feel it is necessary to accompany a child to school during the first week, it is suggested that the student ride the bus and the parent meet their child at the school.

Kindergarten students will attend pre-arranged sessions Aug. 30-31. On Thursday, Sept. 1, morning kindergarten students will take buses to school with other students and be dismissed at 10:30 a.m.; afternoon kindergarten students will take buses to school, arrive at 2:15 p.m. and be dismissed with other students at the end of the day. On Sept. 2, students will attend regularly scheduled kindergarten sessions.

Students can bring their own lunch to school or purchase a hot lunch from the cafeteria for \$1.55. The cost of milk is 45 cents.

The school will be closed for Labor Day, Sept. 5. Back to School Nights will be held starting at 7 p.m. at the Wycallis Elementary School as follows: Sept. 1 for grades 1, 2 and special subjects; and Sept. 14 for grades 3-5. Transfer students and their parents are invited for tours at 10 a.m. and 1:30 p.m. Aug. 25.

An open PTO board meeting will be held at 6 p.m. Sept. 14 in the library. All parents are invited to attend.

Lake-Lehman sets Annual open house

SAT review course offered at PSU-WB

The Penn State/Wilkes-Barre campus in Lehman Township is holding an updated review course for students who plan to take the new Scholastic Assessment Reasoning Test on Oct. 8 or Nov. 5. In addition to critical reading (formerly the verbal portion of the test) and math, the new version of the SAT will include a section on writing which will measure a student's grammar and usage skills and requires a written essay. Students will be required to complete homework assignments between classes and sample SAT exams will be given.

Additional topics will include strategies for sentence completion and effective essay writing, increased reading comprehension, familiarity with math grids and determining when to use a calculator, and the advantages and disadvantages of guessing.

The grade-free review course will be held from 6-9 p.m. each

Thursday from Aug. 25 through Oct. 6 in the Center for Technology. A class for critical reading/writing only will be held from 9:30-11 a.m. Saturday, Sept. 10 at the school. Students may take one or both of the writing/critical reading and math reviews.
