After renting the store from owner Bill Purcell, the Truskas bought the store, living in a small apartment upstairs and, with help from Taft's sister Josephine Evans, owned it for 37
years. "When we started, we would throw the fat, bones, and whatsome Clorox and a truck would come to pick it all up. Then the Environmental Protection Agency stárted coming around and we had potato, meat, and
candled egg inspections." The couple didn't think in spections were bad idea, but the added work load forced them to eventually sell the store in 2004. A fire in 1986 gutted the store and everything had to be thrown
