Theremin virtuoso to appear in concert

World-renowned musician and composer Rob Schwimmer will perform a concert at 8 p.m. Oct. 27 at College Misericordia's Walsh Auditorium. This is no admission charge.

Schwimmer has worked with many famous musicians including Simon and Garfunkel,

Queen Latifah, Bette Midler, Burt Bacharach, Muddy Waters, Stevie Wonder, Kurt Vonnegut and Willie Nelson. He also has written music for Dora the Explorer on Nickelodeon, Sesame Street, the Academy Award-winning movie Dear Diary, and several television movie and shows.

His accomplishments extend beyond composing. He also is a vocalist and arranger whose musical genres include jazz, classical, world music, avant-garde, pop-music, and rock. Schwimmer is one of the few Therenin virtuosos in the world.

The Therenin was one of the first all-electric instruments. It is actually an instrument that is not meant to be physically touched. The box like instrument has two antennas that project from the instrument which the player waves his arms in front of to play.
