C DIVISION

In the first quarter, Zapoticky intercepted a Raider pass and ran it back 22 yards for a touchdown. In the second quarter, Matt Doggett got Kingston Township on the board with a touchdown run from two yards out. Corey Patrick added two points on the conversion run.

Zapoticky scored third and fourth touchdowns in the third quarter to put Dallas ahead, 24-8. Mark Michno added some extra offense, scoring on a 42-yard run.

Kingston Township quarterback Patrick added a touchdown with one second left in the game.

The Dallas defense played one of its best games of the season. Mitchell Benson had two key sacks and Bryan Sotko, Connor Scalleat and Michno also played well.

Dallas and Kingston Township are tied for first place with records of 6-1.

D DIVISION

Justin Sweeney, Cole Dixon scored touchdowns for Dallas, including a 30-yard fumble recovery by Dixon. He also added the two-point conversion. The Mounts defense stopped the Raiders on several scoring chances, led by the line play of Matt Harrison, Jackson Shaffer, and Justin Hutchins.
