built along the creek. Water wheels were used to power different kinds of mills. Water was directed onto the wheels. There were sawmills, gristmills, paper
mills, foundries, tanneries, and mills, foundries, tanneries, and
the like The people running these businesses were not aware of the damage they were causing to the creek. By cutting down all of the
trees, they caused the water flow pendable. In general, at the
time people really weren't concerned with environmental problems. The lack of consisent water flow led to the end
of all of these businesses on of all of these
the creek. Today, we can improve the vegetation around the creek to
help make the water flow more enssistent. If there is more vegetation around the creek, it will help keep the flow of water to the creek gradual and the height of the creek will stay more even. Water flows into
