Three Dallas Junior Mounts youth football teams earned playoff berths as the Wyoming Valley West Youth Football League concluded its regular season action. The opening round of the playoff games will be played Sunday, Oct. 30 at Mountaineer Stadium at Dallas High School.

At 11:15 a.m., the C team will play Kingston, followed by the 12:15 p.m. B division game between Dallas and either Edwardsville or Duryea. The A division will cap things off with a 2:15 p.m. game between the Junior Mounts and Swoyersville.

A DIVISION

Dallas avenged an earlier loss to Plymouth by posting an impressive 30-0 win last weekend. Tyler Shutlock scored three times on runs of 30 and 45 yards, respectively, along with a 75-

yard interception return.

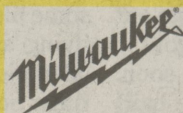
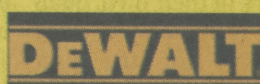
