• Leaves should be raked to the curbside for vacuum collection.

Do not include grass clippings or other yard waste. The vacuum equipment will not function properly if residents commingle yard waste with the leaves.

• Residents are asked to rake all leaves to the curbside in long thin rows approximately 3 feet wide.

Placing the leaves curbside in this manner will facilitate collection. Residents are cautioned not to place any items within the road right of way that may create potentially hazardous or unsafe conditions.

• Residents who prefer to collect leaves and place them in plastic bags may do so by placing the bags curbside for pickup.

Last year the LIHEAP program assisted 350,000 households statewide. Also, most heating companies offer budget programs which balance energy bills by charging a fixed amount each month.
