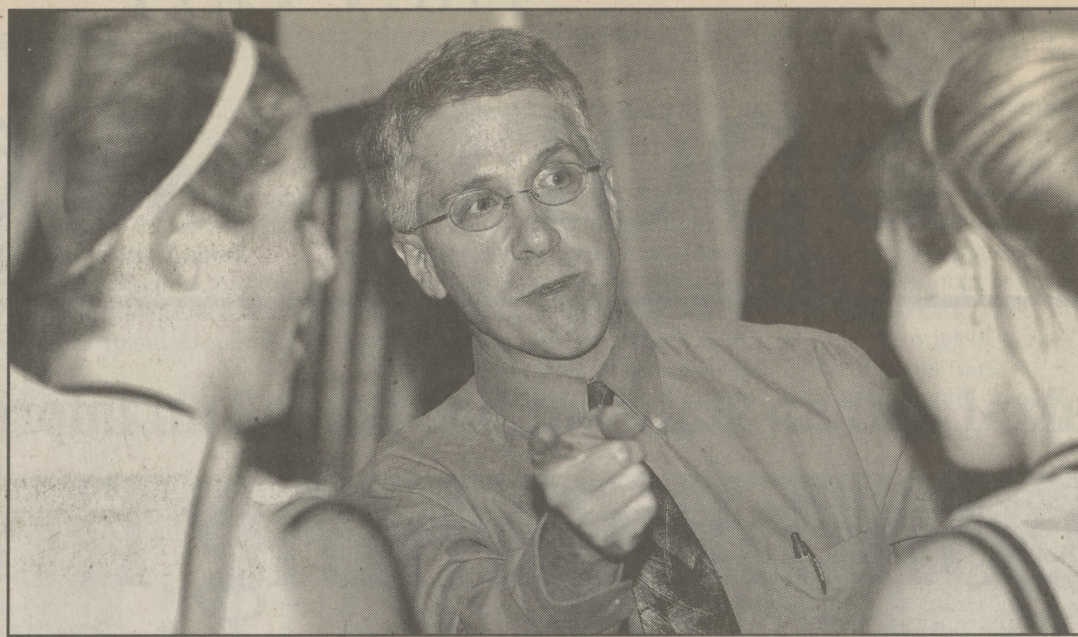
## FOURTH GRADE

Dallas coach Mark Lacey gives his team some instruction.

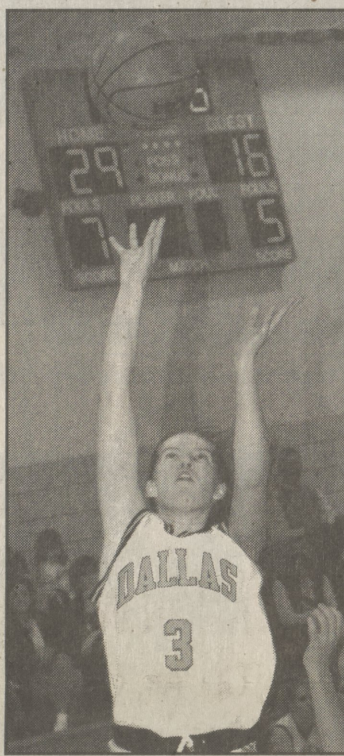
