Jason Robert Jolley of Dallas Boy Scout Troop 281 recently received his Eagle Scout Award during a ceremony at the Dallas United Methodist Church. Jolley earned the highest rank in scouting June 15, 2005, five days after graduating from Dallas High School.

The son of Robert and Mary Ellen Jolley of Dallas has been active in scouting since joining the Cub Scout Pack in Dallas as a Tiger Cub.


