### Former death row inmate to speak

Jay Smith, a member of Witness to Innocence: From Death Row to Freedom, will be the speaker. Smith was on death row for six years and is the only person who received a double-jeopardy decision in a capital case and was completely exonerated by a unanimous Pennsylvania Supreme Court.

Participants will receive background materials from Smith, listen to his presentation and have an opportunity to ask questions on related matters such as the death penalty, death row, trial matters and post-exoneration difficulties. There is no admission charge and refreshments will be served.
