building during the festival and the students will give the coats to needy Back Mountain residents.

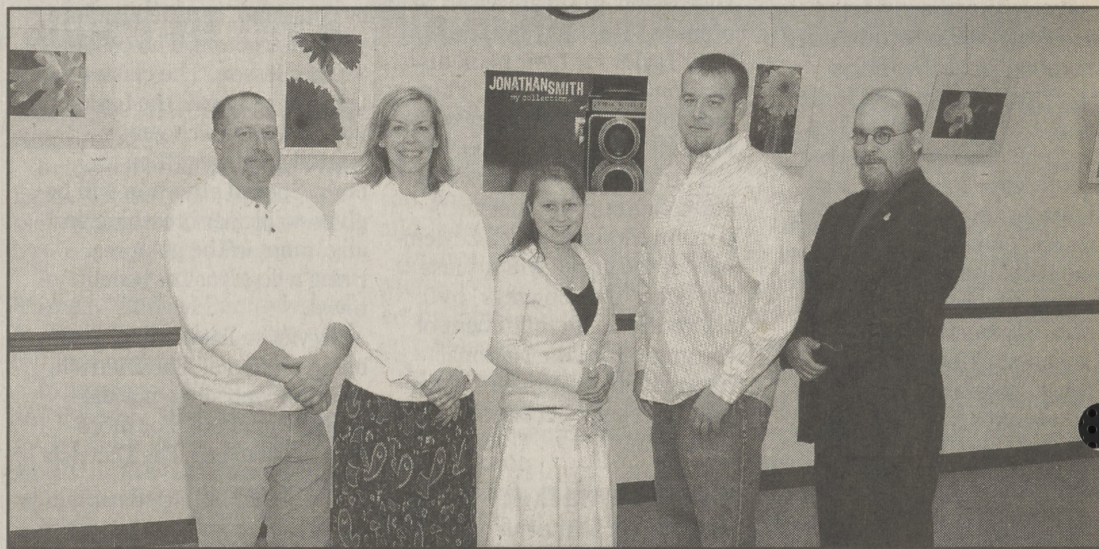
The technical name for the blue house is the SERVE House - Students Explore Recreational and Volunteer Experiences.
