"It was unbelievable how fast the change came," Cardillo's mother, Melanie, said, remembering the progression of the disease. "In 10 months he was completely gone, mentally and physically.'

Petresky had led an extremely active life before dying at 90, Melanie Cardillo said.

"He was president of the historical society in Hazleton and he was in charge of restoration of the historic Brainard Church in the Conyngham area. He was on the staff of the Hazleton Standard-Speaker, ack when it was the Standard-Sentinel.

"When he was 16 he left home to join the circus - he worked setting things up and taking them down - and, during World War II he served in the South Pacific with the Air Force.

"He organized class reunions for McAdoo High School and he was a beautiful tenor. We think Bryan gets his voice from him."

Bryan Cardillo enjoys singing, but the play he wrote isn't a musical. Rather, it's a murder-mystery set aboard a cruise ship peopled with characters you just might recognize from the movies.
