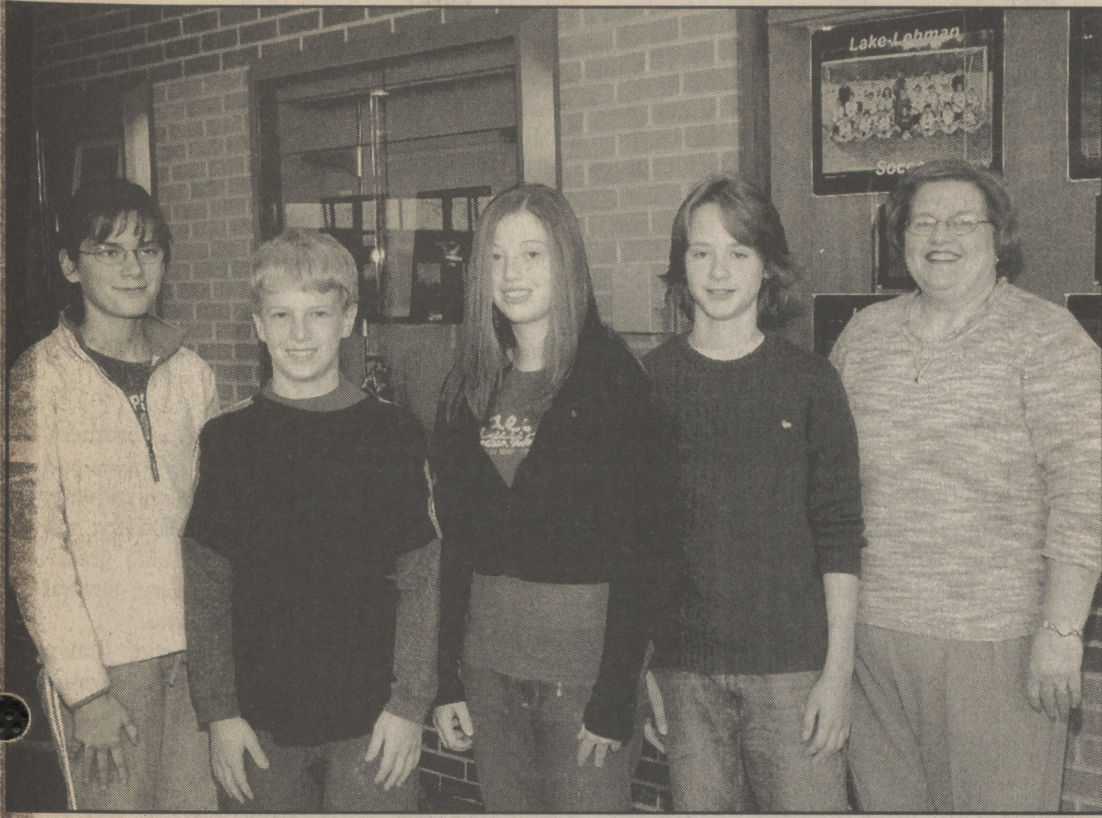


LAKE-LEHMAN STUDENTS RECEIVE HONOR
