tion or from magazines," Madeira said. "Art gives me a whole different perspective on creation. Whether I'm taking a walk or driving in the car I see things differently and have a greater appreciation for them."

The annual art show began after Hand read a 1981 Time Magazine story about 23-year-old Suzanne Rossetti, who locked her keys in her car outside of a convenience store in Phoenix. Two men approached the young woman saying they were willing to help, but murdered her instead.

After reading the heartbreaking story, Hand and her husband Joe contacted Rossetti's parents, Louise and Peter, and expressed a desire to hold an art exhibit in her memory.

More than 1,000 entries were received this year and ribbons were awarded in 12 different cate-

gories for each separate grade level by a pair of panels with three judges each.

senior at Bishop Hoban. "There was so much talent there."


