

## LUNCHEON WITH A SPECIAL AUTHOR TO BE HELD APRIL 26

I'm Big Now preschool-kindergarten will hold its annual

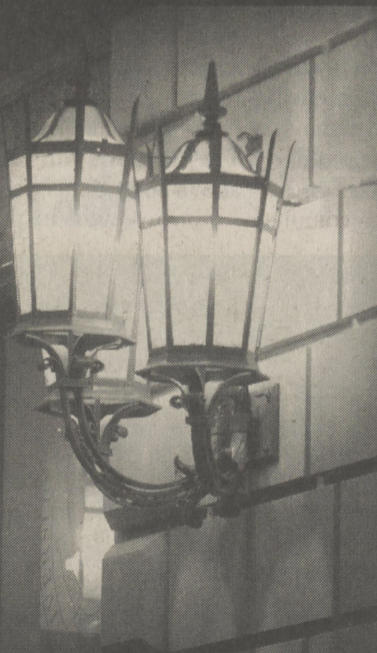
