UGANDA MINISTER VISITS PRINCE OF PEACE CHURCH



The Reverend Canon Charles Busingye of Uganda visited Prince of Peace Episcopal Church in Dallas on Sunday, 13 May. Fr. Charles brought greetings from his family, his church and his bishop. Fr. Charles spoke of the plight of the Batwa people, known to us as Pygmies, who have been put out of the Bwindi National Forest because of the mountain gorillas that live there and are a huge tourist attraction. Because of this, the Pygmy people are disenfranchised; they have no land and no education. In 1992, Fr. Charles and his friend Fr. Fred Tumusiime had formed a mission to reach the Pygmy people from the Bwindi forest to help them with food, clothing, land and education. With assistance from various churches and individuals in the United States over the past six years, there is now land with a village, a school of six grades, a health clinic, a water storage tank. Fr. Charles invited parishioners to become part of the solution to the plight of the Pygmies by sponsoring a child's education for \$20 per month. There will be a pictorial presentation about the current visit to Uganda from May 24 through June 9 at Prince of Peace Episcopal. Shown here following the presentation are, from left, The Rev.
