

Dallas Harvest Festival set to enjoy fifth anniversary

A fifth outing is planned for the annual Dallas Harvest Festival, which this year is scheduled from 1 to 6 p.m. on Sunday, September 16. The event will take place, rain or shine, on a portion of Main Street, Dallas, between the Route 415 intersection and Huntsville Road.

Dallas Days Weekend will get off to a rousing start from 7 p.m. to midnight on Friday, Sept. 14, with the Fourth Annual Dallas Days Dance at the Irem Country Club Pavilion. This year, musical entertainment will provide the timeless sounds of "Just Us" from 7 to 8 p.m. and local southern rock legend, "Abilene" from 8 p.m. to midnight.

Parade starts at 9 a.m.

Commander Clarence J. Michael of Daddow-Isaacs Dallas Post 672 announces the Back Mountain Memorial Parade will be held at 9 a.m. on Monday, May 28.

Parade participants will start assembling at 8:15 a.m.

In the lineup will be the Dallas band under the direction of Todd Hunter; Scout troops, American Legion Baseball team members, Little League teams, Back Mountain Fire and Ambulance, veterans of the Back Mountain, and, for the first time, a number of antique cars.

Anyone else who would like to participate is asked to contact Commander Michael.

A memorial service will be held at the monument in the center of town with State Senator Lisa Baker as the keynote

speaker. Jack Cleary, a Vietnam veteran, is the Honorary Parade Marshal and will offer comments on the Lieutenant Michael J. Cleary Fund. Vice Commander John Emil Sr. will act as parade marshal.

Reverend Roger Griffith will offer the invocation and benediction while Michael Jayne, of Dallas High School, will recite the Gettysburg Address as a wreath will be placed at the monument.

After Taps is played, there will be a regrouping and the procession will proceed to the Woodlawn Cemetery for an additional ceremony where the rifle squad will be used. The day's proceedings will end with a ceremony at Chapel Lawn cemetery.
