The Back Mountain Memorial Day Parade, sponsored by the Daddow-Isaacs Dallas Post 672, honored fallen soldiers. The lineup consisted of the Dallas band, Scout troops, American Legion baseball teams, Little League teams, Back Mountain Fire and Ambulance, veterans of the Back Mountain and, for the first time, antique cars.

Following the parade, a memorial service was held at the monument in the center of town with State Senator Lisa Baker as the keynote speaker. After Taps was played, the procession proceeded to the Woodlawn Ceremony for an additional ceremony where the rifle squad was used.

The day's proceedings ended with a ceremony at Chapel Lawn Cemetery.
