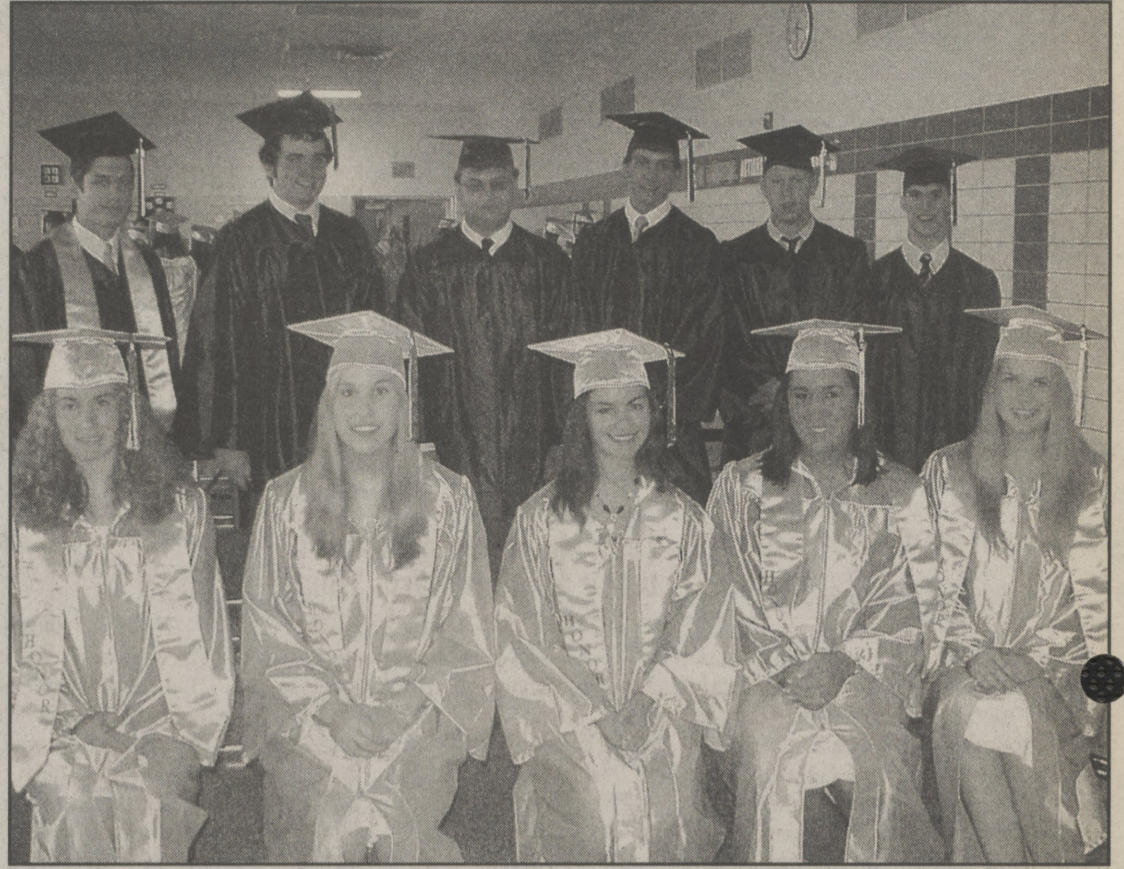


DALLAS STUDENTS RECEIVE CERTIFICATES OF EXCELLENCE

BACK MOUNTAIN'S NEWEST EAGLE SCOUTS RECOGNIZED

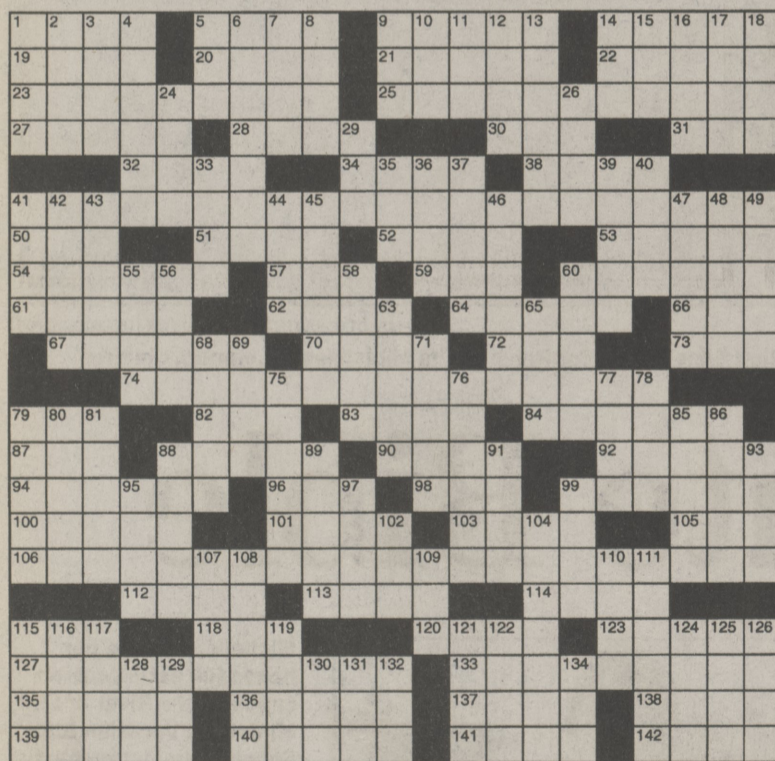

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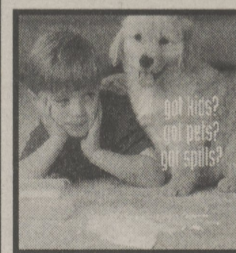
