The concert is sponsored by the Fine Arts Committee of SUMC.

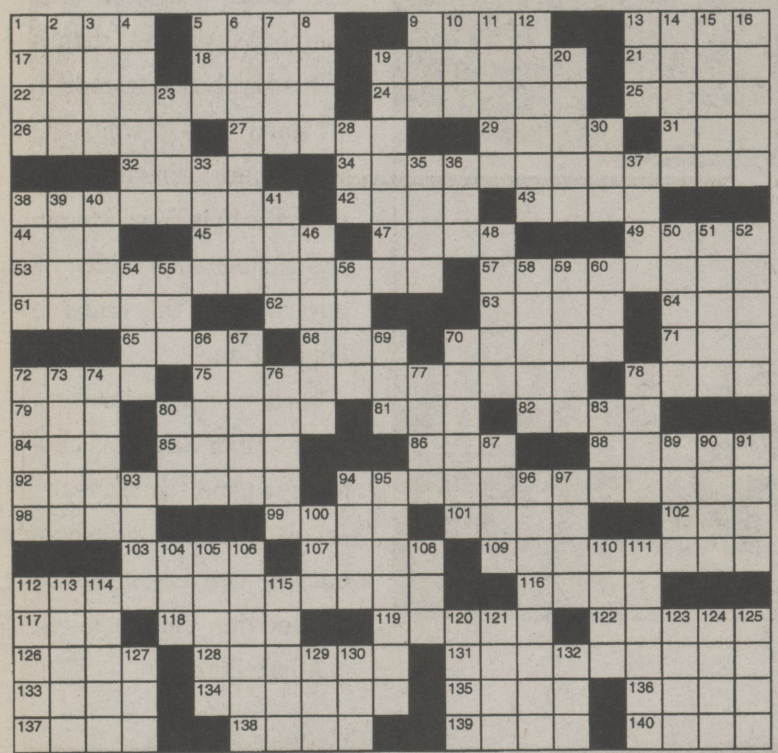

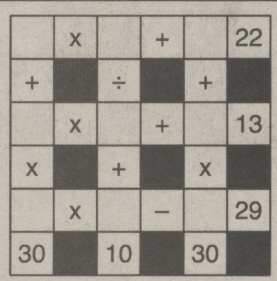

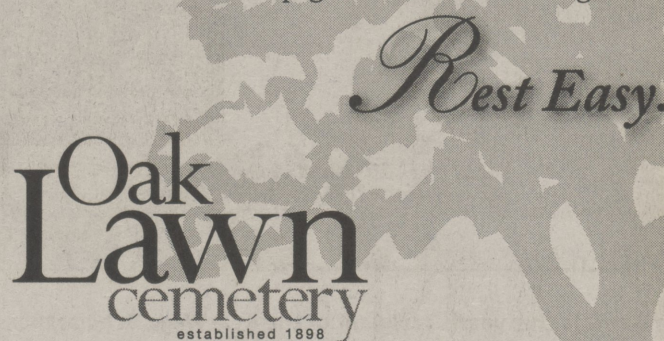
Awana Club meets at Grace Community
