Both were taken by Life Flight from Kingston to Geisinger Medical Center in Danville.

Kyle's injuries were the most serious with head trauma and reconstructive surgery needed.

Refreshments and t-shirts were sold at the fundraiser and raffles were held with gift certificates from area restaurants and busi-

nesses as prizes.

The tournament was a great success with the students raising well over \$2,000.

There were more than 100 participants from Dallas, Lehman, Holy Redeemer and others from as far away as Scranton.

The event was organized by Lake-Lehman students Gaby Olshemski, Erica Johnson and Sarah Leskowsky.

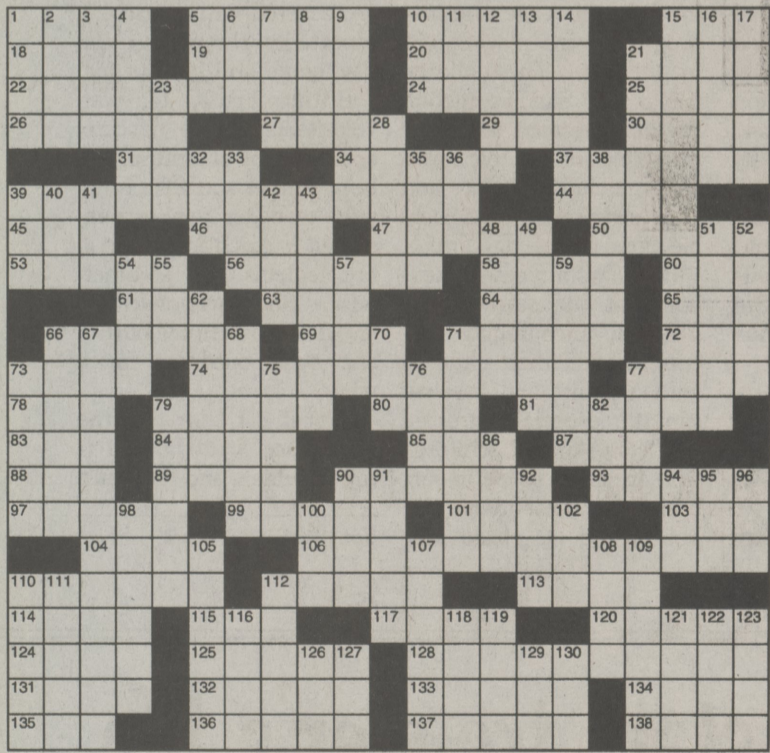

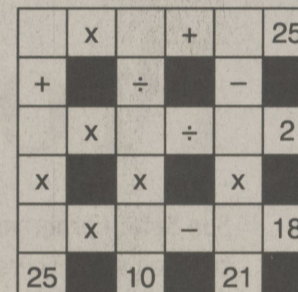

Mary Baker will tell stories at Summer Fest

Popular regional storyteller and guitarist Mary Baker will be one of the entertainment highlights at the annual St. Paul's Lutheran Summer Fest, to be held on the grounds of the Dallas Township, from 8 a.m. to 4:30 p.m. on Saturday, Aug. 11.

The day-long event will feature entertainment, a flea market, a variety of activities for young and old, an art show and sale, and other attractions.

The Summer Fest is free and open to the public.

All proceeds benefit St. Paul's community outreach and church programs.

Mary Baker, a member of the National Storytelling Network and organizer of Voices of the Valley, will present a program for people of all ages, featuring delightful stories and a variety of folksongs, Christian songs, ballads and sing-a-long songs. She notes that she has been singing as long as she can remember and has been told that she has a "beautiful voice."

Other entertainers include

the Christian music ensemble Living Stones, magician and balloon artist Mike Policare, the barbershop quartet "Three Friends and a Baritone" and a troupe of puppeteers from Bethlehem.

Children will enjoy a series of fun and crafty activities during the day, such as face painting, tattoos, a fish pond and a variety of games.

The Fest will also feature "Celebrate God's Creation," an art show and sale that will include works by area artists.

If weather permits, visitors may take part in an "en plein air" or outdoor painting session.

In addition to the flea market there will be a variety of booths selling baked goods, jewelry, used books, flowers and plants and other items.

A Silent Auction also will be held, featuring theme baskets, sports memorabilia and a colorful quilt sewn by the St. Paul Quilters.
