Native crafts, dancing, drumming, storytelling, flute music, and food by the Noxen Fire Co. will also be featured.

Admission is \$3 and free for children under age 5, senior citizens age 70 and older, and handicapped persons. Dogs are welcome but must be on a six foot leash at all

times. Owners must clean up after their pets. Dancers, drums and volunteers are welcome.

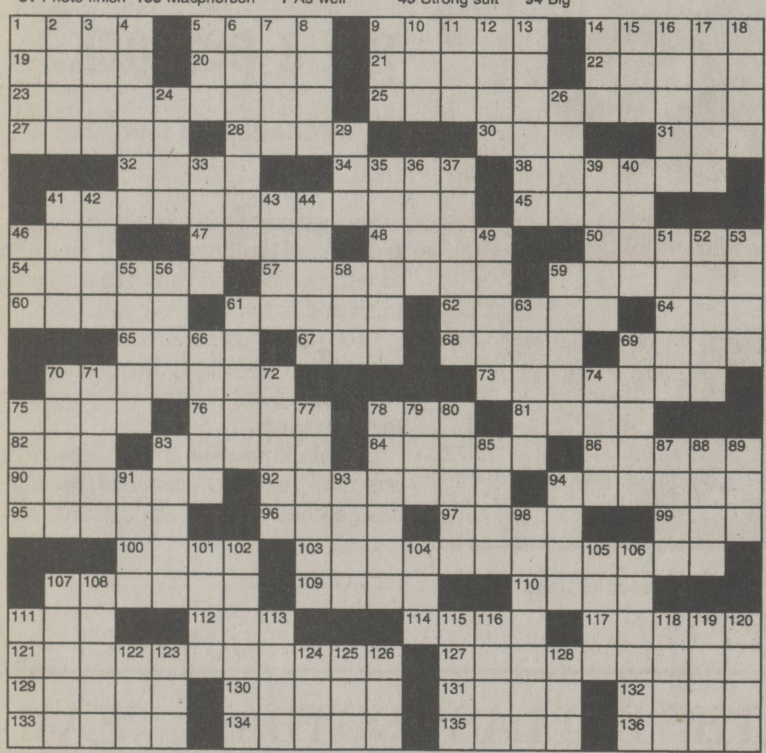
