Known as the seventh planet from the sun, this impressive planet shines non-stop within our solar system like a blue gem. Originating from Greek mythology, the planet is named after the god of the heavens Uranus.

The Friedman Observatory is open to the public and the Penn State community beginning at 9 p.m. during Daylight Savings Time (now through Nov. 3) and 8 p.m. during Standard Time (beginning Nov. 4) on clear Monday nights. Weather permitting, aspiring astronomers will get the chance to see Uranus at Opposition.
