
Cruisers raise \$2K

That direction has led the now Honorable Judge Patricia Whalen to a two-year appointment at the War Crimes Chamber in Sarajevo, part of the Bosnia-Herzegovina state charged with hearing war crimes cases from the former Yugoslavia.

Having been involved with international work in several forums since 1991, Whalen most recently represented the International Association of Women Judges (IAWJ) in the drafting of a treaty at The Hague for the international enforcement of child support. While in The Netherlands, she had the opportunity to observe several other IAWJ judges serving on the War Crimes Tribunal at The Hague, which sparked her interest in working internationally as a judge.
