Leaf collection program begins Nov. 5

yard waste collection and recycling program will conclude for the 2007 season effective November 2. The Road Department had suspended collection of the green recycling containers during the annual paving program that concluded on Friday, Oct. 26, and will collect the yard waste containers for the final time this year no later than Friday, Nov. 2.

The 2007 Dallas Borough Fall Leaf Collection Program will begin on Monday, Nov. 5. Collection will continue throughout the entire month of November or until the first significant snow event of the winter season. The borough asks that residents comply with the following leaf collection guidelines:

Leaves only (no grass clippings or other yard waste) should be raked to the curbside for vacuum

The Dallas Borough curbside collection. The vacuum equipment will not function properly if residents commingle yard waste with the leaves.

Residents are asked to please rake all leaves to the curbside in long thin rows approximately three feet wide. Placing the leaves curbside in this manner will facilitate collection. Residents are cautioned not to place any items within the road right of way that may create potentially hazardous or unsafe conditions.

Residents who prefer to collect leaves and place them in plastic bags may do so by placing the bags curbside for pick-up.






