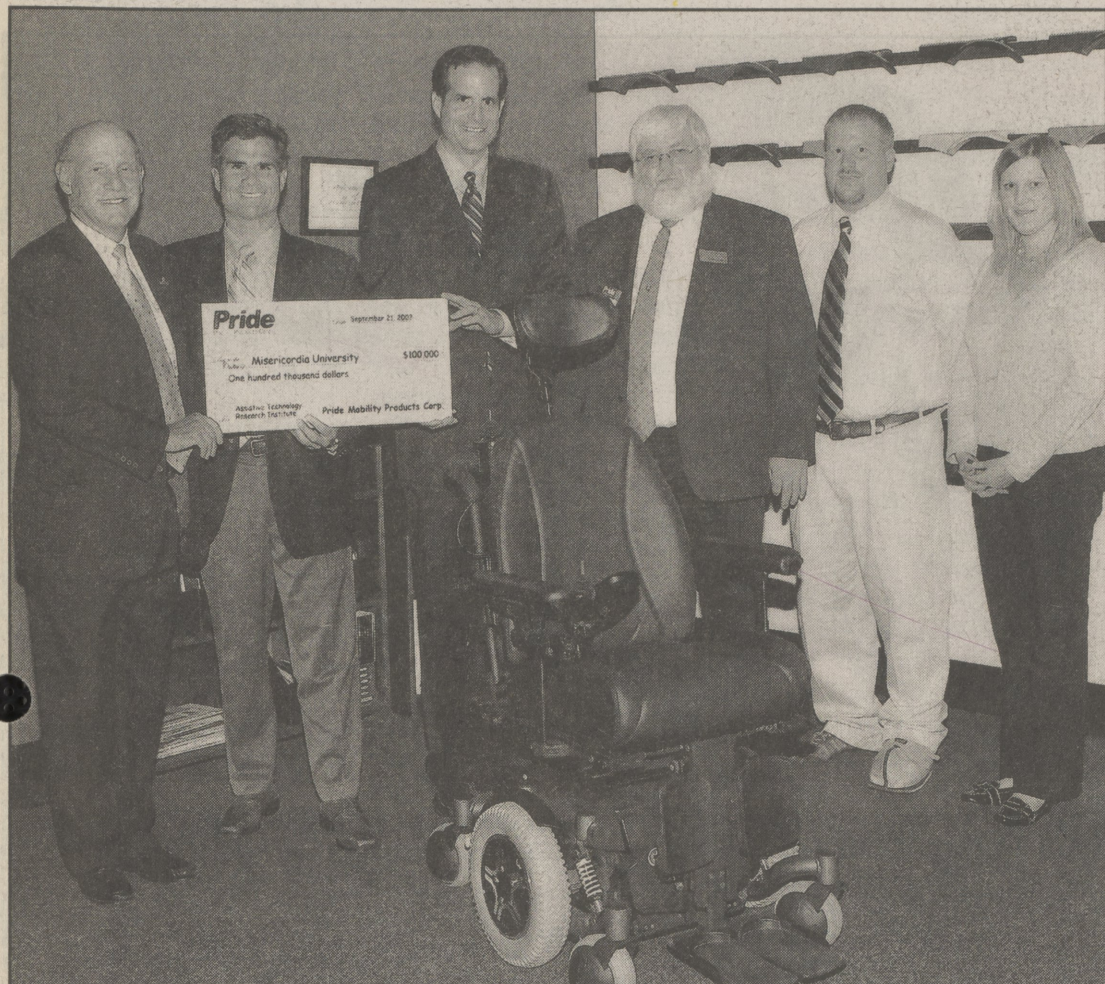


## PRIDE MOBILITY DONATES TO MISERICORDIA

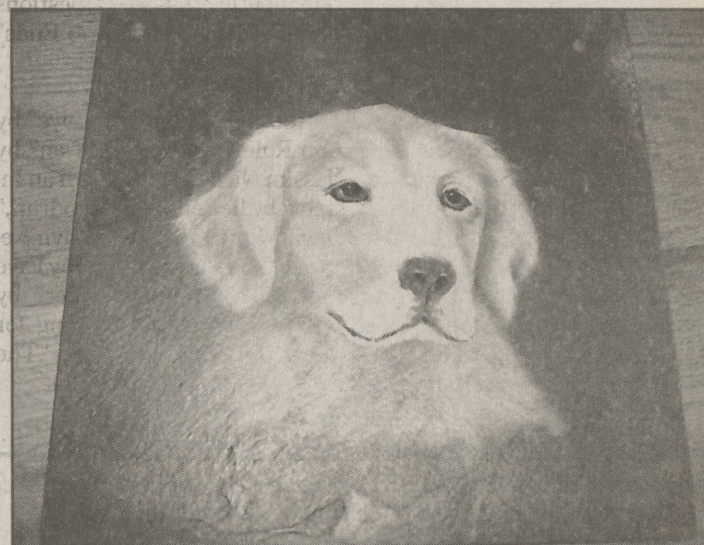
