

60 years of tradition

he Old Shoe trophy, a bronzed size-11 cleat that has been shuffled between Dallas and Lake-Lehman High Schools for the past 60 years, will remain in the trophy case at Dallas after the Mountaineers shut out the Black Knights, 14-0, in this year's Old Shoe football game.

Dallas won its fifth consecutive game to finish with an 8-2 record during the regular season, earning the Mountaineers a playoff berth against Berwick in the District 2 Class 3A semifinal. Lake-Lehman's season ended at 2-9.


