

Harvey places in PA pageant

Bryn Harvey, of Trucksville, was named third runner-up in Pennsylvania's Outstanding Young Woman Program finals on November 24 at Kutztown Area High School.

Harvey, a student at Wyoming Seminary Upper School and the daughter of Jay and Judy Harvey, represented Luzerne County in the program.

Miranda Zimmerman, of Stoystown, representing Somerset County, was named the Pennsylvania's Outstanding Young Woman for 2008 and was awarded \$5,000 in cash scholarships for capturing the title. She attends North Star High School and also won the performing art award for a self-choreographed tap dance. She received the state medallion, a bouquet of flowers, a color portrait and several additional gifts.

First runner-up was Hilary Caldwell, representing Centre County, who received \$2000 while Lindsay Fouse, representing Beaver County, was named second runner-up and received \$1000.
